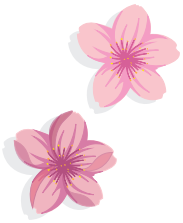

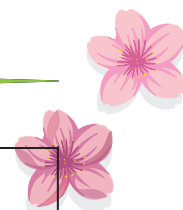

This month we begin with the Annual Event on the 9th of February. In case anyone has not registered, please do so and do bring your “BETTER HALVES”.

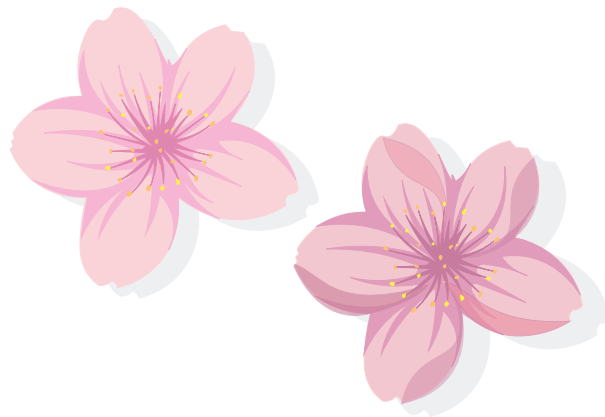
We also have some amazing events, one being a walkthrough of Mumbai’s mini Taj Mahal AND also a seat at the SOI concert rehearsal.

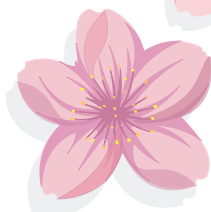
In this meeting, Vipin will show us a teaser of his docuseries, talk about his experience of filming and bringing back music from Zanskar Valley, and answer all your questions.



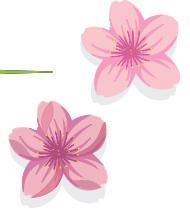

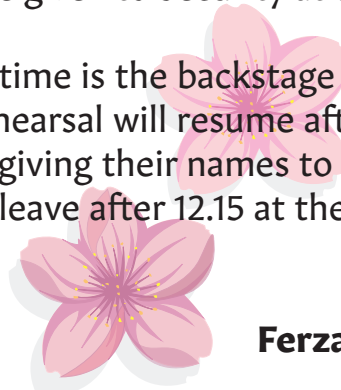
Sir Mark Elder is one of Britain's most acclaimed conductors and Conductor Emeritus of The Hallé Orchestra with 63 appearances at the BBC Proms. The concert begins with the Overture to Oberon from the romantic opera by Weber followed by the triple creation of Overture, Scherzo and Finale of Schumann's symphonic work for orchestra, which has an overall light and friendly character. The concert culminates with one of Beethoven's most celebrated works, the Eroica Symphony, a composition celebrating the memory of a great man – making revolution personal.

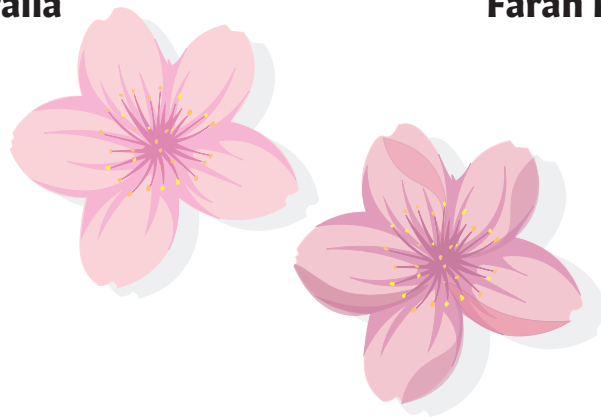

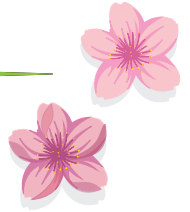
The authors are looking forward to showing you their work & photographs from the book and will discuss the significance of heritage from historical and personal perspectives.

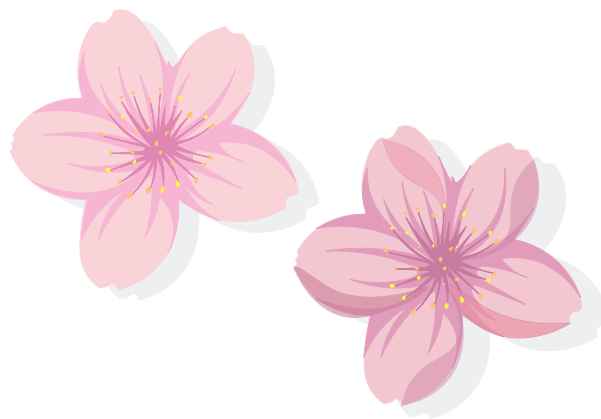

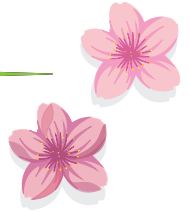

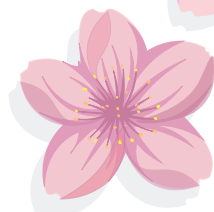

THE MOST BEAUTIFUL PLACE IN MUMBAI AKA THE MINI TAJ MAHAL

Did you know Mumbai has its very own mini Taj Mahal tucked inside the old lanes of Mazgaon?

The comparisons between Hasnabad and the Taj Mahal do not simply end at appearances. While Taj Mahal was built as mausoleum for Mumtaz Mahal by Shah Jahan, Hasnabad was constructed as a mausoleum or maqbarah too by the Khojas to house the mortal remains of Hasan Ali Shah ,the 46th Imam of the Khojas, also known as Aga Khan I.

As menial as it sounds in present-day Mumbai, a grand sum of Rs. 3 lacs was pooled and used to build Hasnabad. A lot of voluntary work also went into constructing the breath-taking mausoleum with three domes, two minarets, multiple archways and exquisite lattice-work. The doors to the main resting chamber of Aga Khan I have silver-inlays and some of the decorations are made of gold. While the maqbarah is made of sandstone, it is clad in Rajasthani marble.

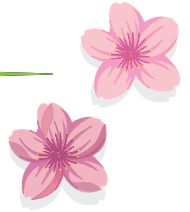
Word on the street is that the lattice-work man-hole like coverings that you see on the floor of the mausoleum is actually not covering a manhole but a series of underground tunnels! We could keep going on and on about the marvel that is Hasnabad but nothing will come close to a first-hand glimpse. NOTE: Members are encouraged to wear comfortable walking shoes, be modestly covered with long sleeved outfits and legs covered. Do carry a dupatta as a sign of respect. There is no provision for refreshments so please carry a bottle of water and your enthusiasm.

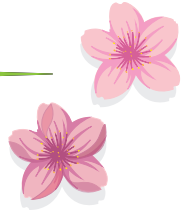

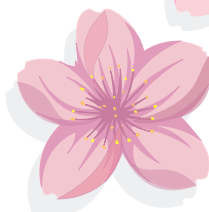

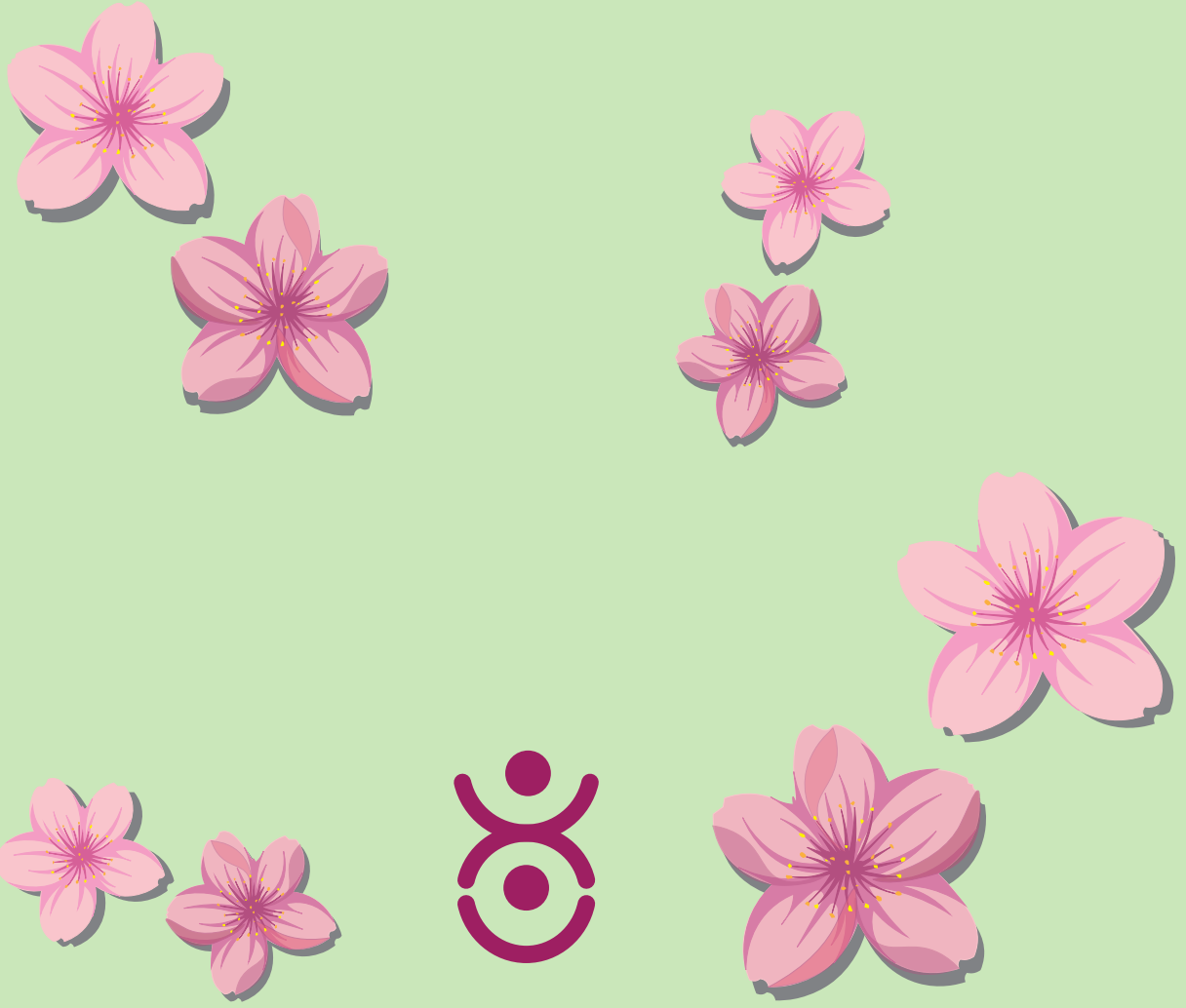
